The Pastor Writes:



Dear Friends,

I came across an interesting idea I would like to share with you during this Season of Advent (a time of waiting) as we prepare for Christmas (the arrival of the Christ child).

The premise of this article was that Christianity is radical and counter-culture. That as Christians, we are not about getting more and more for ourselves, but we are about caring for others more than ourselves, as Jesus taught us through his words and actions. This idea is called, "The Advent Conspiracy" and is an international and inter-denominational church movement. "The idea is restoring the scandal of Christmas by substituting compassion for consumption." Therefore, churches may want to embrace the following four themes:

1. **Worship More** - Worshipping Christ can become the greatest and most enjoyed focus of the season.
2. **Give More** - God gave his Son as a relational gift; Christians can try to give more meaningful, relational and experiential gifts instead of expensive ones.
3. **Spend Less** - Decrease the volume of purchasing and receiving costly Christmas gifts.
4. **Love all** - In the Advent, Jesus enters our poverty so we will no longer be poor. With the money saved by giving relationally and resisting consumerism, people can redistribute money to the "least of these" in their communities and the world. (Homiletics, Nov. 2008, pg 31)

There are many opportunities for worship (Advent services on Sunday, the Longest Night Service, and Christmas Eve worship with special music), activities for children and families— Christmas in Millheim (the Live Nativity), the advent dinner and workshop ("Jesus is Coming" on the 19th), Family Fellowship cookie exchange, caroling, and many other events that you'll find in this newsletter.

There are many opportunities to give more: our Sunday school children will be giving books instead of monetary offering throughout December and the books will be donated to Toys for Tots. Women's Guild will be wrapping up Christmas gifts for the Outreach Center and Skills, along with sending gift cards to Bethany (thanks to our all our members for their contributions). Friends with a Mission are also looking into outreach projects both locally and nationally.

You, as a family, could decide to participate in these ways of honoring Christ rather than accumulating more "stuff". In this way, you would spend less and love more.

Won't you make Jesus the center of your holiday this year? I promise that if you do, you will find a gift like no other— true hope, joy, peace and love, this day and all our days.

Joint Consistory met at Salem.

Parsonage: All the items have been purchased and installed at the parsonage. George Traxler is to fix the soffit. Handicap ramp is pending.

Spiritual Life: Hymn Selection was November 2. There were about 15% more Feet & Seat Covers this year. There were 12 for the Blessing of the Animals. Live Nativity costumes will be handed out at St. Peter's on December 6 at 9:30 a.m. for Christmas in Millheim on December 12. Gift cards for Bethany Children's Home will be collected again this year in any amount. Deadline will be December 14. Pastor Faith will put it in The Grapevine for the Longest Night service to be held December 21.

Church & Ministry: Pastor Faith will be on vacation from December 26 thru January 3. Rev. Marge Holland will be supply for December 28.

Pastoral Relations: Next meeting will be in January, 2009. The Proposed Joint Budget for 2009 was approved and accepted.

The Joint Insurance committee consisting of Brenda Stover, Marilyn, Janie Shook and Donna Auman have done a good job getting coverage for both churches, the parsonage and liability. All coverage will be handled by Frost & Conn saving everyone money. Thank you, ladies.

A donation to the Poe Valley Ministry for 2009 has been tabled pending more information about the park being open or closed.

Auditing committee is Donna Auman, chair and Marilyn Weaver. Nominating committee is Tracy Ridenour, chair and Gary Auman. Nominations need to be announced two weeks prior to the January meeting. Gratuity committee is Don Hampton, chair and Ed Kerstetter.

Thank you to everyone who donated Health Kits. Women's Guild really appreciated your support. We sent 23 complete kits, saving postage to send them to Maryland because Beth Pryor (Brenda Stover & Bonnie DeBrasky's sister) delivered them for us and also paid the \$2 per kit postage to send the kits where they are needed. Thank you, Beth for all the help and kindness you've given this project.

I delivered a fruit basket to Bob Brown when he got home from Hersey following surgery on his broken leg. I understand that cast off, but he cannot put any weight on his leg yet. I'm sure he has quite a ways to go for a complete recovery. We're keeping you and yours in our thoughts and prayers.

The Thanksgiving meal was held on November 8 at the Gregg Township Fire Hall in Spring Mills. There were 61 adults and 6 children present. Joyce Brown once again made Christmas tree decorations for everyone, thank you Joyce. The children were each given a box of crayons and a turkey placemat when they came in and I understand that some of those turkeys looked really nice. Pastor Faith offered the blessing and everyone enjoyed the ham and turkey dinner with all the trimmings, very good. Following the meal, each child was given a gift bag with "busy" stuff inside to enjoy. The entertainment was Ju-st Proclaim (Judy Seymore, Steve Taylor, and Linda Silver) and they did an excellent job - all kinds of music. A basket was passed around to help with the cost of the entertainment and to show appreciation to the ones who prepared and served the meal. The entertainment crew got \$105 and the kitchen staff got a tip of \$104. The evening ended with door prizes being given to the ones with the lucky numbers.

Pastor Faith was instrumental in planning the Ten Days for Peace service which was held at St. John's UCC in Boalsburg on November 9. The theme this year was "Peace, Not Just for Grownups". The guest speaker for the day was Rev. Dr. Anne Ard from the Women's Resource Center in State College. The title of her sermon was "Like Little Children" and she did a very good job. Janie Shook, Pastor Faith, Marilyn Weaver, and Dave and I represented the Charge for the afternoon. Thanks to Marilyn for singing in the choir along with Rev. Ann Graves, Narda Druckenmiller, and John Poorman. The choir was small but mighty. Refreshments were served following the service with a time of fellowship. Good job, Pastor Faith.

Highlights of the November 10 Consistory meeting were: We had to transfer \$700 from Savings to meet the monthly bills again. Our Ameriprise Investment is losing money (isn't everyone) at the present time, but everyone says to do nothing, so for now that is what we are doing. We've transferred from Savings \$2,500 to establish a Discretionary Fund to help people this winter with food, fuel, etc., so if you know of someone in need of help, please let a Consistory member know. We've also transferred from Savings \$2,500 into the General Operating Account to get us thru the end of the year. This money IS NOT in place of your weekly offering! We will be having our Insurance coverage with Frost & Conn beginning January 1, 2009. We are getting a much better rate and neither St. Peter's nor Salem is double paying for anything. The Proposed Budget for 2009 was accepted by Consistory. Adam Ross will be doing the plowing of the parking lot this winter with Donn Fetterolf as backup.

We have pledged \$500 per year for the next 5 years to the "4 Our Churches" capital campaign. At this time, we only have \$106.14 for this year with another Hoss's night scheduled for December 3. Donna Auman still has tickets if anyone needs more - give them to your family, friends, co-workers, anyone. To help us reach our goal of \$500, there will be a special offering taken up on December 7 for just this purpose. There will be envelopes at the middle window at the back of the church. If you want credit for tax purposes, please put your name or offering envelope number on the special envelope.

The Annual congregational Meeting will be held following morning worship on December 7. This is a very important meeting. The proposed budget for 2009 will be put before the members, election of Consistory members will be held and a special vote for worship times will be held. Beginning January 2009, Salem will not have an organist for the 9:30 a.m. service. Joint Consistory President Ken Royer visited with both churches on November 2 asking if it would be possible to have morning worship service at St. Peter's at 9:30 all the time and Salem at 10:45 all the time. Both churches will be voting YES or NO on December 7 and we will go from

there. The last I knew, Gary Auman and Wendell Royer have agreed to run for Consistory members. If you are asked to serve, please give it some deep thought.

Gift cards for the Bethany Children's Home are being collected again this year. Cards for Wal-Mart, Dick's Sporting Goods, or McDonald's will all be welcomed by the Bethany children and I'm sure greatly appreciated. The cards can be dropped in the basket at the middle window in the back of the church at Salem. Deadline is December 14.

Speaking of the back of the church, there are sign up sheets for Janitors, Greeters and Flowers for 2009 hanging on the wall. Please sign up - they will probably be taken down December 21. If you family cannot clean the church by themselves get with another family and do it together.

There are dishcloths for sale to benefit the church's parking lot paving fund. We had had to raise the price to \$1.25, but that's still a great buy considering all you can do with them. They are in the Narthex if you want some or contact Janie Shook, she has them by the dozen. They make great stocking stuffers.

The details for the Secret Sister finale will be made on November 30 at the Soup & Sandwich lunch. So, if you could not be there, please get in touch with Karen Boob to find out how, when and where we will let all the cats out of the bags. Have you figured out who your secret sister is?

Beginning in January, there will be little cloth bags at the back of the church for the children to use during worship services. The bags will contain items like crayons, coloring books, fun pads, stuffed animals, puppets, little dolls, little cars, etc. - you get the idea. The bags and the items in the bags will stay at the church for your child to use during worship if you wish.
