The Pastor Writes:



Dear Friends,

It has been my honor and my privilege to serve St. John's, Salem and St. Peter's UCC. As some of you may have already heard, I have accepted a call to a church in Buffalo, NY. My last working day will be September 30.

I think we have done a great deal in a very short time and I hope that the good work you have begun will continue. Some of the things we have done in just 3+ years are:

*The graceful and honorable closing of St. John's, with members joining our sister churches in equal number. While the process continues, we have secured ownership of the land and building (a lengthy process), repaired the sidewalk to the front of the building, and are beginning the process of clearing out the contents of the building. Hymnals (which contain the orders for worship) have been dedicated to Salem. We all owe a great deal of thanks to the leadership and dedicated work of Shane Royer and his father, Wendell Royer.

*Created, installed and planted the "Comma Garden" in the front of St. Peter's with bricks from the interior chimney of the church, which had to be torn down. Many thanks, to all the volunteers who made this possible.

*Begun the "Friends with a Mission" which has held a community wide Easter egg Hunt, held picnics and social get-togethers to build fellowship with new and current members.

*Sunday school for children with the curriculum the "Whole People of God", bringing the Sunday school total to 14. Childcare has begun at Salem as we see our little ones grow.

*Adult Bible study—one morning and one evening, with members of both churches attending regularly. The morning class has even seen attendance from members from other churches that do not have Bible study.

*Support Group for Grandparents of Autistic Children began in 2008. In addition to providing support, they have also worked to become advocates.

*Web page begun and maintained thanks to Don Hampton and Ginny Hosterman.

*Pictorial Directory (in spite of fire) completed, with help from Doug Royer and committee.

*Consistory retreats at Hartman Center—a time to relax, renew and refresh.

*Provided your pastor with time and financial support for continuing education—classes at Gettysburg Seminary, PA Clergy Gathering in Harrisburg, Convocation at Hershey and PTSD training in Lancaster. I was also honored to be a Synod delegate this year.

*Supported your pastor as she served the Northern Association Ministry Planning Committee, NA Church and Ministry Committee, Hartman Center Grand Camp, participated in Women in Rural Ministry, Ministerium and Northern Association Annual Conference in Selinsgrove.

*Continued as a 5 for 5 church, and pledged your support for the Capital Campaign, 4 our Churches.

Beyond these tasks, we have grown with visitors and new members. Our Christmas Eve service was blessed with a solo performance by new member, Candace Lowe in 2007. Even though ice cancelled our 2008 service, it sure made us realize how important that service is to families, our friends and us!

Worship was blessed by a Suzuki violin performance by young attendee Huck Tricsch and our Black Panther Picnic was blessed by a recorder performance by young attendee Emmett Schafft

Yes, it has been a busy time, a growing time, and a time filled with many Holy Spirit "nudges"! I pray you continue in grace, leading the churches into the future you have already begun to envision. You are the leaders you have been waiting for!
